We contribute knowledge about emerging and continuing management challenges such as business ethics, corporate social responsibility, governance and control, corporate venturing, entrepreneurship, international management, global strategies, organizational behavior, organizational learning and knowledge management, organizational renewal, organizational restructuring, organizational decline, M&A, and strategic alliances. We value theoretical and methodological rigor, encourage methodological pluralism and establish linkages between theory and practice.
